When the city began building the commuter tunnel, Aion was forced to relocate to 12th and Cherry. Following that, the city began building the Convention Center and Aion then had to move again. Making his final move, Aion chose Rockledge to be the home for Berben Insignia. At the time, the company also made uniforms. In January 1987, Aion sold the uniform company and concentrated on working with the met-

Herman Aion was a jeweler and a benchman. It is said he worked hours and hours at the bench perfecting his craft of jewelry making. After passing in 2001, Aion's daughter, Elyse R. Aion took over the ownership and run-

ning of Berben Insignia.

Elyse joined her father's team in 1996 and says, "It's the best thing I ever did." She has her master's degree in health education from Saint Joseph's University. After working for several years in health and wellness programs, Elyse decided to join the family business. Now

she is the driving force behind it.

Elyse prides herself on the customer service of the company. "Once we get a customer, we rarely lose them." Berben Insignia is willing to go the extra mile for their customers. "We highly value our customer," Elyse adds. When calling Berben Insignia during work hours expect to speak to a person, not a menu. They are even willing to come in on off hours for special requests.
